We have seen lack of commitment by most TEEZ
Member Churches through non-remittance of Annual
Membership subscriptions and also the TEEZ Sunday

This calls for a change of mindset so that we begin to show ownership of the institution as that is a constitutional mandate and obligation.

It is my hope and prayer that in 2022 we will be able to see serious financial commitment towards the work of TEEZ.

Letter from the Chief Executive Officer & Executive Director

Dear church leaders, partners, supporters and all our stakeholders locally and globally,

I bring you greetings from the secretariat of the theological education by extension in Zambia (TEEZ).

It is with great pleasure that we share with you the operations of this great institution.

The year 2021 has come to the end with both successes and challenges. All these are emanating from the current COVID-19 pandemic which has affected most of the activities. Despite these challenges, we still maintained our tagline of innovation, transition and transformation to reach out to the grassroots churches and communities.

With our tagline and our strategic plan theme of 'reshaping the future of TEE through church and community service', the institution continues to record visible impact of its work among churches and local communities.

One thing we are proud of as an institution is a strong resource mobilisation strategy. Our fundraising strategies are very strategic in the sense that TEEZ as an institution does not stop marketing itself even in the midst of plenty.



During the year, we recorded some new insights into how TEE work can remain relevant to the needs of the church and individuals.

Notable among some innovations already making impacts in people's lives is the BETTER church & society program brand which is receiving a lot of interest and support from the dergy and spouses. More details about the BETTER church and society are highlighted under activities in the field.

Our ecumenical involvement has also improved greatly as can be seen from a number of activities we have attended in at least 50% of the TEEZ member churches this year.

This is giving TEEZ a visibility that it exists and still carrying on its vision of 'preparing all god's people for works of service'.

We believe in the dream of joseph's story about the 7 lean years and 7 years of plenty. But one thing we can be proud of is that our resource base has increased from a mere K958,300 in 2017 to K4.6 million in 2020; registering a 500% increase in funding.

Despite COVID-19 in 2021 TEEZ has managed to raise up to K3.3 million. This increase has been as a result of collective efforts, team work and also selflessness among TEEZ staff. In the year under review, TEEZ has developed new partnerships namely the resonate global mission and african leadership transformation foundation. Both partnerships are bringing on board huge gifts in ministry and experience. We look forward to nurturing these relationships well in the next 3-5 years.

I am also excited about the dream of making TEEZ sustainable. What started as a dream in 2017 in my three-year vision at the taking over of the leadership at TEEZ has now become a reality following the approval process by the executive committee.

The approval process has brought the realisation of the formation of the business conglomerate company of TEEZ to be called 'theological enterprise & agribusiness corporation' whose acronym is 'TEAC'. I am grateful to god that my office has finalised the development of the business concept whose project is valued at US\$1.35 million (equivalency of K22.353 million) to run from 2022 to 2026. This is an ambitious undertaking and we are confident of realising our dream. Agood number of our staff have had their contracts coming to an end by 31 December 2021. As part of our staff approach to quality assurance and control system, there has been a lot of transformation and change of mindset among them. This has been enhanced by our annual performance appraisal system. Using this system has helped our staff to make positive adjustments in relationship to improvements at places of work.

Teamwork, Team Building are very critical in any successful organisation

You can not do the same things time and again and expect different results. Innovation transforms an institution

I am excited to mention that all our staff whose contracts were coming to an end have been renewed for period ranging from 2 to 4 years.

Our staff have proven that change is possible when there is a dear vision for an institution. They have bought into the institution's vision and are individually put in their best to make things happen.

We want to assure you that there is a lot planned for the year 2022. Our training and development department is working around the dock to make sure our implementation strategy leaves a lifelong mark in the lives of those impacted by our ecumenical ministry.

We look forward to interacting, walking together and enjoying our fellowship through our various platforms of doing god's mission.

Introduction

Theological Education by Extension in Zambia (TEEZ) was founded in 1979 by 2 Churches.

From a membership of 2 denominations, TEEZ currently has 9 Member Churches

The Organisation was founded in 1979 and it's officially registered under the laws of Zambia as a faith-based Non-Governmental Organisation through the Office of the Registrar of Societies.

The organisation is also registered under the USA Federal as a Ministry Partner of the Global Ministry (501)3 in the State of Indianapolis. This makes it easy for the institution to receive donations under the USA charitable status.

Theological Education by Extension in Zambia (TEEZ) ministry and work is aimed at providing based theological and community development training to Church leaders, pastors and ordinary Church members in order to 'prepare all God's people for the work of Christian service' (Ephesians 4:12).

The institution's mandate is bringing courses, trainings, and capacity building programs by extension. Our trainings are taken to the grassroots where students. This makes our courses and training affordable and within their context.

TEEZ is an important tool to support the growth of Churches in Zambia so as to bridge up the gap that existed due to limited trained and ordained Pastors/Reverends/Priest.

TEEZ takes the school to where people live and serve within their context.

CCTV (Church Community Transformation Ventures) in Prison Ministry

This program is meant to bring behavioral change among inmates in correctional facilities by providing training programs which will help inmates easily and purposely be integrated into the community with something they can offer to society upon completion of their sentences.

2021 saw the program implemented in three correctional facilities on the Copperbelt Province.

These were Kamfinsa Correctional Facility (Kitwe District), Kansenshi Correctional Facility (Ndola District) and Chingola Correctional Facility (Chingola District). All the inmates and Chaplains/Correctional Officer were trained in the Tutors Course.

FAITH (Financing Appropriate Innovation Through Household) Economic Empowerment

- FAITH Empowerment is the TEEZ's Church Community Social Outreach Program.
- The focus of the program is financial inclusion for Churches.
- FAITH continues to transform Church based savings groups.
- In 2021 FAITH trainings were conducted in Mpongwe, Sesheke, Mumbwa, Ndola and Chirundu districts.
- TEEZ empowerment congregation based savings groups with a FAITH Microfinance Revolving Fund amounting to K60,000.
- 6 FAITH Saving Groups received K10,000 each as Empowerment Funds to help members boost their businesses and improve their financial capacity.
- The Empowerment Fund was paid back to TEEZ with a 10% interest over a period of three months in three equal instalments of K3, 666.00 per month.
- All Six FAITH Savings Groups have complied fully with the terms and references of the Empowerment fund and have since repaid the loan.
- Our 16 FAITH Saving Groups are undergoing a capacity building and mentoring process across the country.
- The 16 FAITH Saving Groups have a total monetary value of more than K1,000,000.00.



FAITH Empowerment has created opportunities at congregation levels.

Beneficiaries of the FAITH call it a Congregational Financial Game Changer FAITH is the driver of local financial inclusion for empowerment

Member's purchasing power, implementation of personal projects, starting and restarting of small household businesses have increased.

TEEZ staff have also benefited from the Microcredit Fund.

In 2021, TEEZ set aside K50,000 which staff accessed and paid back at a 10% interest rate.

By December 2021, the Microcredit Fund had increased from K50,000 to K198,000. Our TEEZ have failed to access bank loans hence setting the TEEZ Microcredit Fund. Through this fund, our staff have acquired land, building houses and developing some enterprise as the fund is specifically meant to empower staff for their lives after leaving employment at TEEZ.

The WISE Green Church is a project brand which started in 2017.

It is based on an ecumenical focus aimed at creating awareness among the 9 TEEZ Member Churches on the care of creation and the sustainable use of resources for economic livelihood. Through the WISE Green Church Agroforestry program, TEEZ devised the objective to engage faith communities in practicing environmental stewardship to reduce the high rate of deforestation in the selected areas. The second objective of the project was to encourage participants to create new actions for improving environmental stewardship in their communities.

CHIPULUKUSU WISE GREEN CHURCH PROJECT

The WISE Green Church Project was rollout in the Ndola District of the Copperbelt Province in a low affluent compound of Chipulukusu by one of our WISE Environment ambassador. Different trees and seedlings were distributed to four groups as follows: Chipulukusu Community of Christ Church, Tulina Yesu Saving Group, Bombesheni Saving Group and ZAIVITAN Community of Christ Church.

The quantities of the trees were as follows:

- 120 Lemon Trees
- 105 Jatropha
- 60 Umbrella Trees
- 60 Peas
- 50 Pine Trees
- 40 Moringa Trees
- 40 Pawpaw
- 40 Shade Flowers
- 36 Guava Trees

- 10 Cotton Trees
- 10 Avocado Trees
- 7 Katuka

Timothy Leadership Training

In 2017 TEEZ partnered with Timothy Leadership Training Institute in Grand Rapids, USA to promote this practical theology program.

TLT is a global program under the auspices of the Christian Reformed Church in North America. The 7 modules are Caring for God's People, Christian Stewardship, From Harm to Harmony, Biblical Preaching, Teaching the Christian Faith, Praising God in Work and Worship and God's Plan for Sustainable Development

In 2021 we had 19 students graduating as Advanced Traniers/Facilitators in Ndola Currently TEEZ has more than 500 church leaders and members attending TLT in various modules









Business Enterprise Development (BED)

This is a new model for TEEZ in promoting the Business Enterprise of Providence TEEZ Lodge.

The concept has now given birth to the long-term TEEZ Business Corporation under the Conglomerate of TEAC (Theological Enterprise & Agribusiness Corporation).

The formation of TEAC was approved by the Executive Committee and became effective this year in June 2021.

Good Couples' Campaign against GBV

Women and girls make up 51% of the national population and the gross inequalities and inhuman conditions that they endure both as a result of multiple factors such as teenage pregnancies, child marriages, gender-based violence and other harmful cultural traditional practices continue to suppress their freedoms and economic transformation. This has resulted in women suffering worst forms of neglect, abuse and gender inequality at household and community levels.

In some sections of society, girls are regarded as forms of prestige and wealth as they are destined for marriage so that the father benefits from some of form of wealth or livestock (cattle) as payment for the girl child's downy.

In some areas according to the Zambia Police, an average of 50 people a day experience sexual gender based violence (SGBV). It is widely believed that many cases go unreported and the numbers keep going up.

The Good Couples Campaign is one of our Social Program which was first held in Ndola in 2018 has continued to impact families, churches and communities through awareness and training of GBV Combat Ambassadors.

TEEZ conducted the Good Couples Campaign against Gender Based Violence in Mongu in the Western Province.

With the help of personnel from the Zambia Police, the capacity building focused on Gender Violence and Child Protection.

It is becoming a common occurrence and every day thing to experience violence against women and girls. Every day a report of violence against women case either in rural or urban areas is mentioned.

The Good Couples Campaign against Gender Based Violence is a TEEZ program brand that is meant to contribute to the breaking of the silence on any forms of violence perpetrated in faith communities

Discerning Exceptional Community Initiatives & Development for Empowerment in HIV/AIDS Ministry

This is a TEEZ HIV/AIDS initiative.

The brand focuses on behavior change communication strategies, care and support and capacity building for faith leaders and communities.

Under this program we supported 10 orphans and vulnerable children (OVCs) school going children between grades 8-10.

The support included school requisites (a pair of shoes, school bag, books and uniform).

Additionally TEEZ provided school fees for the whole year for the benefiting children of Almslow Community in Kitwe.

TEEZ staff and TLT Advanced Facilitators had the privilege to attend an international retreat organized by Timothy Leadership Training in collaboration with Resonate Global Mission through Eastern and Southern Africa Ministries.

The retreat which was hosted at the Samfya Waterfront Lodge by the beach of Lake Bangweulu in Samfya had two sets of activities. The first mode of the retreat was the virtual meetings and presentations focusing on Team Building and Team Work as part of the need to improve service delivery.

The second one was an in-country retreat, social recreation and bible sharing.

The program attracted participants from Ethiopia, South Africa, Malawi, Uganda, Kenya, USA and Zambia.

We are grateful to our partner Resonate Global Mission for financing this program.









Resource Mobilisation

Resource Mobilisation is a continuous process for Theological Education by Extension in Zambia. The institution believes in harnessing and nurturing the existing partners and donors while at the same time seeking new grants opportunities.

The resource mobilisation strategies for TEEZ are categorized into three sections namely:

1. Local incomes

Under this component, the staffin the various sections and departments set targets of what resources need to be brought into the common pool.

This strategy is spearheaded by the Training & Capacity Development Manager.

Additionally, other personnel such as the Business Lodge Manager are incorporated so that TEEZ tap into the resources raised from Providence TEEZ Lodge. This is done to enhance our local sustainability strategy.

2. Existing Partnership

TEEZ has had long standing partnerships with organisations and churches globally. These continue to provide resources to support the ministry of TEEZ.

These partnership have continued to hold TEEZ in high esteem because of the innovations and creativity that the institution has put in place which has proven effective in the current trends of doing TEE.

3. New Proposal Development Initiatives

One of the key factors that has enabled TEEZ to record a significant increase in its funding threshold and annual budget is the third component. This is a new component that has transformed the way of doing TEE. Through this process and the creation of packed program brands, we continue to attract funding from old and new partners.

Team Work

Section 2 (Existing Partnerships) and 3 (New Proposal Development Initiatives) are spearheaded by the Chief Executive and Executive Director of TEEZ.

Each year as a team, we work towards meeting our set targets and this is intertwined to staff annual performance appraisals as all TEEZ staff now work on performance based contracts.

Resource Mobilisation/Financial Status for 2021

In 2021 Theological Education by Extension in Zambia (TEEZ) unveiled a K3,271,500.00 budget. Of this budget, TEEZ managed to raise K3,352,344.27, showing that we exceeded the budget by ZIMK 80,844.27 This has motivated the staff to do more as signs shows that it is possible for TEEZ to continue tapping into both local and external support.

This can however be achieved when there is fiscal discipline in the utilization of resources.

In the period 2010-2016 TEEZ raised up to K7,613,420.00

In the period 2017-2023 we have raised up to K19,029,129.08

From a K958,300 in 2017 as annual income to K3,352,323.33 is an increase funding of about 400%.

The growing of fruit trees has boosted household nutrition in Ndola where individuals and churches participating are seeing the benefits of implementing the WISE Green Church Initiative.













Stories of Change in BETTER Church & Society

After training Pastors and their spouses in the BETTER Church and Society in September 2021, we formed two cohorts of BETTER Church Groups. Fach cohort was drawn from different districts and provinces which included Chirundu, Lusaka, Ndola, Mpongwe, Kitwe, Mansain Cohort 1 (Kitwe Training) and Sesheke, Mwandi, Livingstone, Kalomo, Choma, Mazabuka in Cohort 2 (Livingstone Training).

Following these trainings, the Livingstone Clergy & Spouses FAITH Saving Groups launched their group with an initial saving of K11,000 in October 2021.

In the second saving, they contributed about K20,000. The group went to make the third saving.

At the end of December 2021 the Livingstone TEEZ Clergy & Spouses BETTER Church Saving Group managed to share their money to empower each other amid COVID-19.

The sharing was necessitated so that they start a new saving cycle that will run from January to December 2022.

In 2021 we have recorded significant increase of about 70% income.

With the engagement of the right staff and increased investment into Providence TEEZ Lodge has recorded good incomes. Furthermore, the Lodge has managed to disburse a total of K 214,804.00 to TEEZ as part of the grant support to the operations of TEEZ's ministry. The Board of Directors of the Lodge also meet regularly to provide oversight and receive feedback on the

performance of the

lodge.

Our main plans for the future are in the following areas:


